



WEEE Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE)

The UK Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Regulations were introduced in 2007, with the aim of reducing the amount of electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) ending up in landfill. They require ‘producers’ and ‘distributors’ to finance the collection, treatment and recycling or reuse of this fast-growing and problematic waste stream.

Shoal Group is committed to the Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Regulations (WEEE), EU Directive. This requires that electrical and electronic equipment, when being disposed of at the end of its useful life in an EU Member State, it must be recycled and/or disposed of in accordance with the EU directive as it is applied in local laws of that State. These regulations go further by making the manufacturer or importer (the producer) of the goods responsible for their disposal/recycling in the correct manner.
